



2009 Registration Instructions and Checklist

You may register with an initial payment of \$50 nonrefundable registration fee until Tuesday, May 26, when full payment is due. After May 26, if you have not paid in full, you will be assessed a \$100 late fee. If you have an overdue balance, you risk losing your housing assignment and space in limited-enrollment and waitlisted courses. When registering during late registration (Wednesday, May 27–Thursday June, 25), you must pay full tuition and fees, including a \$100 late fee, at the time of registration. Online registration is not available for IEL S-B50, IEL S-D50, or IEL S-G35.

Instructions

To register for an IEL program, you must complete Form IEL-A, Form IEL-P (Registration Payment Form), Form IEL-F (required if you are not a US citizen or permanent resident), and Form IEL-H (required if you are requesting on-campus housing), and submit them with a nonrefundable \$50 registration fee to Harvard Summer School, 51 Brattle Street, Cambridge, MA 02138-3722 USA. The Summer School is not responsible for forms that are lost in transit. If you are applying to IEL S-B50 or IEL S-D50, you must submit a copy of your acceptance letter from an English-language master's program in business administration, architecture, or design for fall 2009. If you are applying to IEL S-G35, you must submit a letter that you write in English, in which you describe your international business experience and goals, and a one-page resume. When completing registration forms, please clearly print all the information and write your legal name on every form. Be sure to sign and date those forms that require your signature. Additional forms may be downloaded from the Summer School website.

Payment. The nonrefundable \$50 registration fee and completed payment form must be submitted with your registration form. The remaining balance must be paid by May 26. If you register or complete payment after May 26, you are assessed a \$100 late fee. All payments must be in US currency, payable through US banks. Checks should be payable to Harvard Summer School. MasterCard, Visa, American Express, and Discover are accepted, provided that the name on the credit card is that of the student registering or written permission from the cardholder is enclosed. If you are paying by credit card, please use a card without a daily charge limit. Payment also may be made online at www.summer.harvard.edu (with a credit card or echeck) or through interbank wire. Wire payments should be sent no later than Friday, April 24, to meet the deadline for full payment on Tuesday, May 26.

Checklist

- FORM IEL-A: Harvard Summer School 2009 Registration Form.** Your US Social Security/Taxpayer ID number (if available) is requested for identification purposes and for the Summer School for compliance with the US Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997. If you do not have a Social Security/Taxpayer ID number, leave this section blank.
All Summer School students are required to have health insurance provided by a US health insurance company. If you do not indicate on Form IEL-A that you have such coverage, you will be enrolled in the insurance plan offered by the Summer School and charged the premium.
- FORM IEL-P: Registration Payment Form.** This form must be completed and submitted with your payment and Form IEL-A for your registration to be processed.
- FORM IEL-F: International Student Information and I-20 Request Form.** You must submit this form if you are not a US citizen or US permanent resident, even if you are not requesting an I-20 from the Summer School. If you need an I-20 from the Summer School for an F-1 student visa, you must answer "Yes" to that question on Form IEL-F, provide all required information, and include a prepayment of \$950 with your registration. You must register early enough to ensure that you will receive your visa by your departure date. **The Summer School will not issue I-20s to students who do not meet all of the I-20 requirements by April 30.** If you enter the United States on an F-1 visa, you must remain enrolled full time. If you are currently studying at another school in the United States on an F-1 visa and you intend to return to that school in fall 2009, you do not need to request an I-20 from the Summer School. If you are currently studying at another school in the United States on an F-1 visa and you will not return to that school in fall 2009, you should request an I-20 from the Summer School. For more information, see the back of this sheet.
- FORM IEL-H: Housing Application Form.** If you wish to live on campus in Summer School housing, you must submit this form with the housing prepayment of \$950, one half of which is nonrefundable. None of the prepayment is refundable if housing is cancelled after May 26.
- FORM IEL-IM: Immunization Certificate.** If you will attend Harvard Summer School while on any kind of visa or if you will live in Summer School housing, you must comply with Massachusetts immunization regulations and provide proof of immunization against certain communicable diseases. You must have FORM IEL-IM completed and signed by your health care provider and submit it to the Summer School by May 26, or you must receive the required inoculations at your own expense when you arrive at Harvard.

International Students

The F-1 student visa is appropriate for those who enroll full time at the Summer School and whose primary reason for coming to the United States is to study. If a Summer School student intends to enroll full time in the fall at another US institution, it is important to enter the United States on an F-1 student visa in June. A student who is currently studying at another US institution on F-1 student visa status and intends to return to that institution in the fall does not need to request Harvard visa sponsorship for the summer. A student who is currently studying at another US institution on an F-1 student visa and will not return to that institution in the fall should request Harvard visa sponsorship for the summer.

I-20 Certificate of Eligibility for an F-1 student visa

Students applying to the English for Design, English for the MBA, or English for Global Business program are eligible for I-20s upon admission. Visa processing times vary from country to country. Students are responsible for requesting their I-20s early enough to receive their visas by their departure dates. I-20 certificates are not issued to students who do not meet all of the I-20 requirements by April 30.

Students entering the United States on F-1 student visas must remain enrolled full time. Those who fail to do so are subject to removal from the United States. Students with Summer School I-20s may add courses online but may not withdraw from courses online. They must submit all course withdrawals, even those that are part of add/drop course changes, to the Registrar's Office for approval.

Students who plan to travel to Canada while studying in the United States should visit the Canadian consulate in their home country before departure for the Summer School to determine if they need a Canadian visa stamp.

International student check-in

Summer School students who are issued I-20s by the Summer School must check in with the Harvard International Office before picking up their Summer School ID cards. (See the calendar.)

B-1/B-2 visas and visa waivers

B-2 visas are for people whose main reason for visiting the United States is tourism. If students intend to pursue full-time study, neither the B-2 visa nor the B-1 business visa is appropriate. Many countries are part of a visa-waiver program. Citizens of these countries may travel to the United States as tourists without obtaining visa stamps on their passports. The rules regarding study are the same for the visa-waiver program as for the B-2 tourist visa; full-time study is not appropriate. Students who enter the United States under this visa-waiver program are admitted for a 90-day period and cannot change their visa status or extend their stay in the United States. Students should check with their local US consulate or embassy for more information.

Course Restrictions

If you enter the United States on an I-20 from Harvard Summer School, you are required to register and remain enrolled in a full-time program of study (8 credits for undergraduate or graduate credit or for noncredit in an intensive Institute for English Language (IEL) day program and to attend classes held on the Harvard campus. Therefore, you may not enroll in study abroad programs, MATH S-300, MATH S-307, MATH S-310, BIOS S-111, or in any course as a distance education student.

If your primary language is not English and you enroll in any class other than an IEL class, you must demonstrate your English language proficiency before your I-20 will be issued, and no later than April 30, 2009. Visit the Summer School website for information about how to satisfy the English proficiency requirement.

Financial Requirements

Students registering for the Harvard Summer School must have \$11,000–\$12,600 available to cover Summer School expenses. Expenses include full-time tuition, room and board, and health insurance, all of which must be paid to the Summer School (if applicable) by May 26 to avoid late fees. Expenses also include books, local transportation, and personal expenses that are purchased after the student's arrival. Students who are accompanied by other family members need an additional \$1,470 for each adult and \$800 for each child for the seven-week period (including health insurance, if applicable). These are estimates only and do not include travel expenses. Students should not submit payment to the Summer School based on these estimated amounts; they should submit payment based on the amounts listed on their Summer School bills.

You must submit a prepayment of \$950 before your I-20 will be issued, unless you submit the housing prepayment.
